

### Quarterly credit system lending growth





### Household debt with main credit institutions





### Growth of M3 and bank credit





### Growth of M3 and DMB's credit to domestic sector





### Base money and repurchase agreements with the Central Bank Based on 3-month moving averages





### The Central Bank repo rate and interbank interest rates Vikulegar tölur






### Long-term nominal Treasury bond yields Daily data



Term structure of nominal interest rates April 21, 2006





Yields on indexed long-term bonds






Indexed interest rates; average bank lending rates and real yield on housing bonds and T-bonds


Interest rate spreads

Between bank non-indexed prime rates and the policy rate; between bank indexed lending rates and T-bond real yield




